Instaurator Ruinae

The motto of our Clan often arouses great curiosity and therefore it will be interesting to know that it comes from the Old Testament prophesy of Isaiah – Chapter 58, v 12. This Book deals with the judgement of God on His people because they have forsaken Him and served other Gods. Isaiah speaks at a time when they will be captives in a foreign land, a time when even the walls of the city of Jerusalem and of the Temple will be in ruins and completely destroyed.

Running side by side with the note of judgement, there sounds forth the note of hope. A remnant of God's people, who remain faithful in the midst of all the revolt and rebellion against Him, will one day return to Jerusalem and rebuild the walls of the city and the Temple. What was once in ruins will be repaired and restored.

Here then is the background to our motto which literally means the "restorer of ruins". As to the date of the motto this is difficult to fix accurately but Sir Thomas Innes of Learney, the former Lord Lyon, considered that the correct Latin should have read "Instaurator Ruinam". Hence we may find an old Latin Bible with a passage in incorrect form that can indicate a date.

If any Latin or Biblical scholar has any views on this matter, we should be interested to hear from them, though ancient usage and the present Lyon's Letters Patent confirm that the motto remains unchanged.

Director Human Resources Peter McMahon said secondments can be an excellent career opportunity.



How much were you paying five years ago?


Close to only half of what we pay now.
